This policy applies to all users of the library system and service - our users include registered students, faculty, and staff of the Institute. We also extend limited access to alumni, external researchers, and members of affiliated institutions as per specific agreements.

Principles

ICAT is committed to the provision of high-quality, diverse, and accessible resources for all users through the library system and service.

The following principles apply:

Resource Acquisition

The Institute acquires resources through purchase, licensing, donations, and membership in consortia. The selection of resources aligns with the Institute's academic programs, research interests, and is guided by factors such as relevance, demand, quality, and cost.

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Resource Maintenance and Updating

The Institute ensures the availability, accessibility, and integrity of our digital resources. Resources are regularly reviewed and updated to maintain their relevance. Obsolete or superseded resources are retired as per our collection management guidelines.

Guidelines for Use of Electronic Resources

- a. Users must respect the terms and conditions as specified by the license agreements.
- b. Use of resources should be for personal, educational, or research purposes only.
- c. Systematic downloading, distributing, or retaining substantial portions of information is prohibited.
- d. Commercial use, re-publication, or selling of resources is strictly prohibited.

Intellectual Property

Students must be aware of and respect intellectual property rights and ensure the proper use of copyright material; this means not using another person's work without their permission and proper citation, not infringing on copyrighted material, and respecting the terms of licenses and contracts. Students should be aware that certain coursework, research, inventions, or other intellectual creations they produce while enrolled at ICAT, particularly when using institution resources or as part of institution-led projects, may be owned by the institution in accordance with the institute's *Intellectual Property Policy*.

Violation of intellectual property rights, including plagiarism, copyright infringement, or unauthorised use of another's work, are considered serious offences and will not be tolerated. Students found to be in violation of this policy may face disciplinary action, up to and including expulsion.
